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### **TEASER**

FADE IN:

1 EXT. SPACE - ORBITING SHOT - ENTERPRISE

1

The Enterprise is in orbit around the Earth.

KIRK'S VOICE

Captain's Log, Star Date 2571.3. Using the light-speed squared factor, the Enterprise has moved backward through time to the 20th Century.

2 EXT. SPACE - THE EARTH

2

The Earth as seen from outer space.

KIRK'S VOICE

Our position... in high orbit around the Earth. The year 1968... The beginning of the most critical period in man's history. Our mission... historical research. Utilizing the ship's deflector shields to remain unobserved...

3 INT. CORRIDOR

3

SPOCK and KIRK just concluding a discussion. Spock crosses off towards the Transporter Room as Kirk crosses to an elevator. The door opens. Kirk enters The door closes.

KIRK'S VOICE

... we are monitoring all Earth communication in an attempt to solve the centuries old mystery of how Earth survived the desperate problems faced during the 1960s and 70s.

DISSOLVE TO:

4 INT. BRIDGE - ANGLE ON ELEVATOR

4

As the elevator doors open and Kirk emerges. He stops, surprised. We can HEAR the SOUND of hoofbeats... HORSES GALLOPING!

We are watching a chase scene from "BONANZA"!

### 6 ANGLE ON CONTROL ROOM CREW

6

They are all watching Bonanza with great fascination.

### 7 ANGLE ON KIRK

7

Still beside the elevator door, his amusement is now completely replaced by annoyance.

### 8 ANGLE ON CHEKOV AND COOKE

8

They are both at Chekov's control seat. LT. DAVID COOKE is in his early twenties... bright, quick, charming, personable, equipped with a ready wit and an incurable romanticism about Earth's 20th Century era.

COOKE

Fascinating, wasn't it?

**CHEKOV** 

Great.

COOKE

It was called "Bonanza." One of the most popular historical dramas of the period.

### 9 ANOTHER ANGLE

9

as Kirk now moves forward towards them.

KIRK

(tightly)

And what else do you find fascinating about the era, Lieutenant? They all look at him, startled, chagrined.

COOKE

(a half-hearted explanation)

Sir, we were only monitoring a telecast of...

(CONTINUED)

9 CONTINUED:

KIRK

(interrupting
 tightly)

I asked you a question, Lieutenant. What else do you find of interest in the 20th Century? You seem to be something of an expert on the era.

COOKE

(sweating slightly)

Well, sir... there were hamburgers, and drive-ins, and love-ins and...

KIRK

(overriding)

And atomic wars! Arms races! Hunger! Disease! Poverty!

(to Chekov)

Return to normal scanning, Chekov!

**CHEKOV** 

(hastily)

Aye, aye, sir.

Quickly, he punches a control.

10 VIEWING SCREEN 10

The "Bonanza" scene is cut off, and is replaced by the normal orbital view of the Earth below them.

11 ANGLE ON KIRK 11

He is still angry.

KIRK

We're not here for your amusement, gentlemen, and the next one of you who forgets that will...

He is interrupted as the whole ship SHUDDERS, forcing them to grab hand holds for support.

SPOCK'S VOICE

(filter)

Transporter Room to Captain. Transporter Room to Captain.

Kirk flips Communicator switch.

(CONTINUED)

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11 CONTINUED:

11

KIRK

Kirk here. What's happening, Mr. Spock?

SPOCK'S VOICE

(filter)

I believe we have accidentally intercepted a transporter beam, sir. Of unusual power.

KIRK

This is 1968, Mr. Spock! There were no such devices in...

Again, the ship SHUDDERS. Again, they have to grab handhelds.

SPOCK'S VOICE

(filter)

Logically so, Captain...

### 12 INT. TRANSPORTER ROOM

12

Spock at the console. The panel lights are flashing wildly.

SPOCK

... but a beam has triggered our transporter circuits into operation.

Again, a shudder. He glances towards the transporter chambers.

### 13 ANGLE ON TRANSPORTER CHAMBERS

13

A surge of electronic power is crackling through one of the chambers.

KIRK'S VOICE

(filter)

Can you disconnect?

# 14 ANGLE ON SPOCK

14

at the console.

SPOCK

Trying, sir. The controls appear to be locked open.

15 INT. BRIDGE 15

Kirk at communicator. Cooke nearby.

KIRK

On our way, Mr. Spock.

(to Cooke)

Lieutenant.

Kirk hurries towards the elevator, Cooke at his heels. The door opens. They enter. The door closes.

### 16 INT. TRANSPORTER ROOM

16

Spock working desperately at the console controls. The ship shudders.

### 17 TRANSPORTER CHAMBER

17

Again, the electronic flashes.

## 18 ANOTHER ANGLE

18

as Kirk and Cooke enter, cross quickly towards the console. Spock glances up.

SPOCK

Check circuits for bearing, Lieutenant!

COOKE

Yes, sir.

Cooke immediately turns to an inspection of circuit readings.

SPOCK

(to Kirk)

The beam appears to be heading towards Earth. I am certain our interception was totally accidental.

Again, the ship shudders. Again, they grab for hand holds.

KIRK

Mr. Spock, either disengage or bring it aboard! Our ship can't handle much more of this!

(CONTINUED)

18 CONTINUED: 18

SPOCK

(to Cooke)

Bearing.

COOKE

(awed by the

reading)

74 Mark 5. 113 parsecs.

Spock punches up the controls.

COOKE (cont'd)

(to Kirk)

Sir, that's coming from the edge of the galaxy. There can't be a transporter beam that powerful.

Again, the ship shudders. Again, the electronic flash

KIRK

(snapping)

If you can bring it aboard, Spock, do it quickly!

SPOCK

(making a final

adjustment)

Energizing now, sir.

He punches a control. They look towards the transporter chamber.

19 TRANSPORTER CHAMBER

19

The surge of electronic force, then a faint shimmer.

20 COOKE, SPOCK AND KIRK

20

They watch tensely.

COOKE

Something's coming in, sir.

They continue to watch for a beat, then react... startled.

21

# 21 TRANSPORTER CHAMBER

The shimmering is beginning to solidify to a hazy form, which gradually takes shape. The figure they have pulled in from deep space is that of a man... a man impeccably dressed in a 20th Century business suit!
